Missouri's Future

The consequences of child abuse and neglect are far-reaching and very long lasting. Child abuse and neglect severely impacts the health and safety of communities and jeopardizes Missouri's ability to grow and prosper into the 21st Century.

Child Abuse & Neglect **Costs Missourians:**

- Millions of dollars each year in educational supports, mental health treatment, medical expenses, legal costs and services.
- Billions of dollars over time in lost productivity, lack of readiness to work, mental illness, chronic disease treatment, increased violence, criminal behavior, unemployment and substance abuse.

Child Abuse & Neglect **Costs Children:**

- Ability to learn and be successful in school.
- Impaired physical, mental and emotional development.
- Shorter life expectancy with dramatic increases in long-term serious and chronic health issues.
- Poor emotional health and a dramatically increased likelihood of developing psychiatric disorders.
- Severe behavioral consequences such as drug involvement, delinquent activity, teen pregnancy and abusive behavior, even at a very young age.

Prevention Pays...

\$1 spent on prevention saves \$7-18.

We Believe...

- Every child should be safe, nurtured and supported in their family; every family should be safe, nurtured and supported in their community.
- Diverse family structures, values and cultures shall be honored and respected.
- Children and families benefit most from long-term commitment and investment in outcome-oriented and evidenced-based prevention strategies.
- Every caregiver, family and community should have access to resources to strengthen families.
- All systems at all levels should be accountable to the families, children and communities they serve.
- Everyone should take responsibility and be engaged in efforts to prevent child abuse and neglect.
