- Remember to use the drivethrough convenience provided by banks, dry cleaners, pharmacies, restaurants & other businesses.
- Pay at the pump at gas stations.

Strong Families, Safe Kids

It's a car accident you can prevent.

- Never leave children alone in or around vehicles.
- Always keep car keys & remote openers out of reach of children.
- Keep vehicles locked at all times, even at home, & remind your friends & neighbors to do the same.
 Unlocked cars pose a risk to children who are naturally curious & often fearless.
- Teach your children the dangers of a car & let them know it is not a toy or playground.
- Make your child as visible as possible. Place rear-facing car seats in the middle of the back seat.
- Establish a routine of checking the back seat every time you exit the car to ensure no one is left behind. Do not overlook sleeping infants.
- Ask your babysitter or childcare provider to call you if your child hasn't arrived as scheduled.
- Place your child's diaper bag or a small toy in the front seat to serve as a constant, visible reminder of your child's presence in the car.
- Try to plan ahead when you have errands. Run errands when your spouse, trusted neighbor or friend can watch your child.
- When a child is missing, check vehicles & trunks immediately.
