History

The Children's Trust Fund (CTF) was created by the Missouri General Assembly in 1983 as a fund dedicated solely to support child abuse and neglect prevention programs throughout the state. CTF is authorized to enter into contracts with public or private agencies, schools or qualified individuals to establish community-based educational and service programs focused on preventing child abuse and neglect. CTF is also directed to facilitate information exchange between stakeholders interested with child abuse prevention and to provide statewide public education regarding issues facing families and children.

CTF is not appropriated state general revenue funds for child abuse prevention. Funding is obtained from dedicated fees on marriage licenses and vital records, sales of the CTF specialty license plate, voluntary contributions designated on Missouri State Income Tax Returns, other voluntary contributions, and interest income from the Fund. CTF also administers the Community Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) Federal Grant.

Missouri KIDS COUNT Data Book

The *Missouri KIDS COUNT Data Book* is a collaborative project of the Family and Community Trust (FACT), Children's Trust Fund (CTF), the Office of Social and



Economic Data Analysis (OSEDA) at the University of Missouri, and more than 20 public and private organizations across the state. CTF and the Annie E. Casey Foundation provide the primary funding for the data book and data tool. The mission of the *Missouri KIDS COUNT Data Book* is to improve the well-being of Missouri's children and families. The data book and website are easily accessible tools to assist local and state public policymakers and child advocates in identifying both needs and solutions for Missouri's children and their families.

First produced in 1993, the *Missouri KIDS COUNT Data Book* is the state's most comprehensive compilation and analysis of data on child well-being, documenting the status of children in all 114 Missouri counties and the City of St. Louis. A Message from the Director

The ongoing mission of the Children's Trust Fund is to strengthen families and prevent child abuse and neglect through:

- Grant distribution In Fiscal Year 2015, CTF distributed \$2.55 million in prevention funding to 90 community-based organizations throughout the state. These organizations in turn provided critical prevention services and programs to benefit thousands.
- Public education CTF continues to invest in a strong, innovative public education plan using a mix of media and social media to inform multiple audiences about Strengthening Families Framework, Shaken Baby/Abusive Head Trauma prevention, not leaving children unattended in vehicles (Not Even For A Minute), Safe Sleep, preventing child sexual abuse and positive parenting.
- Awareness Prevention is everyone's responsibility. Each dollar invested in prevention yields seven times or more saved. CTF brings attention to the importance of early brain development in children, the damaging effects of early trauma and adverse childhood experiences (ACES), and how the five essential protective factors present in a family can dramatically increase the likelihood that abuse and neglect will NOT occur.
- Partnerships CTF connects with essential national, state and community organizations, both private and public, to help parents and families with the positive supports they need to make their families stronger and kids safe. By working together, we are able to maximize our resources, share expertise, reduce duplicative efforts, increase awareness and better serve all Missourians.

Missouri Strengthening Families Framework (SFF)

Strong Parent, Stable Children Curriculum Development & Training As part of CTF's ongoing Strengthening Families Framework (SFF) efforts, CTF partnered with the Departments of Mental Health (Project LAUNCH) and Health & Senior Services (Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems) and the University of Missouri-Extension to create a training curriculum and toolkit designed to promote SFF Protective Factors. According to the Center for the Study of Social Policy



(http://www.cssp.org/reform/strengtheningfamilies) "the five protective factors at the foundation of Strengthening Families are characteristics that have been shown to make positive outcomes more likely for young children and their families, and to reduce the likelihood of child abuse and neglect." SFF Protective Factors include Parental Resilience, Social Connections, Concrete Supports, Knowledge of Parenting and Child Development and the Social and Emotional Competence of Children.

The Strong Parents, Stable Children curriculum/toolkit was created by David Schramm, Ph.D., and Kelly Warzinik, M.S., at the University of Missouri-Extension/Human Development and Family Science. The training curriculum tools have proven to have wide relevance, cross-sector usability and have been highly effective in increasing knowledge of the five SFF Protective Factors. Dr. Schramm has conducted twenty-one trainings directly reaching 881 service providers and parents. One participant reflected that the training was "Absolutely relevant to the work I do with pregnant and parenting teenagers every day. Excellent ideas and motivation to teach and partner with families – including my own 4 kids."

Of the 360 surveys tabulated, statistically significant gains in knowledge and understanding of all five SFF Protective Factors has been demonstrated (figure 1).



Strengthening Families Conference

In partnership with the Department of Health & Senior Services, CTF co-sponsored the statewide Strengthening Families Conference March 27-28, 2015 in Columbia, MO. The conference was offered at no cost to Missouri parents, legal guardians and caregivers from around the state, giving them an opportunity to network and attend training sessions. With a focus on building protective factors, participants could choose from several training topics including: building leadership at the personal and community level; understanding the impact of stress; fostering healthy relationships; and using café models to strengthen communities. CTF's national training partner, FRIENDS National Resource for Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention, presented three sessions.

Missouri Prevention Partners (MPP)

The Children's Trust Fund is a founding member of the Missouri Prevention Partners (MPP), a coalition of 23 statewide public and private organizations and individuals with a mission to strengthen families and prevent child abuse and neglect in Missouri. MPP believes:

- Every child should be safe, nurtured and supported in their family; every family should be safe, nurtured and supported in their community.
- All systems at all levels should be accountable to the families, children and communities they serve.

The Coalition convenes three times per year to develop goals and outcomes around leadership, public education and outreach, and resource and policy development. Over the last year, MPP developed and implemented a public awareness and social media plan targeting child abuse prevention, developed and implemented a coordinated strategy to promote Child Abuse Prevention Month in April, and recognized local community coalitions and organizations for actively integrating the Strengthening Families Framework Protective Factors known to strengthen families and reduce or prevent child abuse and neglect.

Home Visitation Prevention Services

With funding provided by the Missouri Department of Social Services (DSS), CTF partnered with Nurses For Newborns (NFN) to provide essential home visitation prevention services in St. Louis City/County, Franklin, Jefferson, St. Charles, St. Francois and Washington counties. Additional counties served include Lincoln, Butler, Carter, Iron, Reynolds, Shannon and Wayne. These services, provided by registered nurses, target parents twenty-one years of age or younger and parents exceeding this age who are mentally and/ or physically challenged or who are substance abusers. The project focused on promoting effective parenting skills, prevention of repeat teen pregnancies, increasing educational achievement, increasing self-support and self-esteem, promoting healthy birth outcomes, and ensuring the safety and overall well-being of children. In Fiscal Year 2015, NFN provided 5,068 service hours through home visits to 868 families (1,717 individuals) as a result of this project. Outcomes reported include prevention of subsequent pregnancies among teen moms participating, increased immunizations of infants, reduction in the inappropriate use of emergency rooms, and 100% of participants free of a substantiated report of child abuse within the reporting period.

Safe Cribs for Missouri

As a result of the support of the Children's Trust Fund, the Safe Cribs for Missouri program continues to fill a vital need in many

communities. CTF provided \$25,000 in Fiscal Year 2015 to the Department of Health & Senior Services (DHSS) to support this collaborative effort. The program, in its fifth year, is implemented through the local county health departments and



provides safe portable cribs and crib sheets to low income pregnant women and those with newborns. A prenatal home visit or educational session is provided to each family receiving a crib, as well as a follow-up home visit following the infant's birth. Families include those experiencing unemployment or underemployment, a lack of education, inadequate housing, domestic violence, chronically ill children and a lack of transportation. To avoid duplication, the program is not implemented in counties where there is already an active safe crib program. In FY15, CTF funding provided 126 cribs along with individual safe sleep information to families in 29 counties. Families receiving cribs resided in the following counties: Adair, Bollinger, Caldwell, Cape Girardeau, Cedar, Clay, Cole, Dade, Dunklin, Hickory, Howell, Iron, Jasper, Lafayette, McDonald, Mercer, Mississippi, New Madrid, Nodaway, Ozark, Pemiscot, Phelps, Platte, Polk, Reynolds, St. Clair, St. Francois, Scott and Washington.

Activity Plan

CTF provides awareness of various prevention messages through available literature and a comprehensive public education plan. CTF contracts with Learfield Communications, Inc. and Firehouse Design to develop an annual strategic plan for its advertising/media and public relations/social media campaigns. The related activity plans include a media mix of print, radio, cable television, transit, radio billboards, website, literature design, blogs, news releases, podcasts, transit, texting, Facebook, Twitter and YouTube.

CTF's donor campaigns promote general CTF awareness; CTF donations, including the Matching Gift Program and Amazon SMILE; the sale of its specialty license plate; and the Tax Checkoff Program. The prevention campaigns focus on the importance of prevention, strengthening families, Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS) prevention, safe sleep environments, positive parenting, sexual abuse prevention, emotional child abuse and neglect prevention, the dangers of leaving children unattended in or around vehicles, realistic expectations of children, child safety and dealing with stress.

At no charge to Missouri residents and organizations, CTF offers rack cards, posters and DVDs to its partners, State departments, hospitals and other child serving agencies throughout Missouri for training purposes and as general information to share with parents and caregivers.

Missouri State Employees Charitable Campaign

CTF received \$1255.62 in Calendar Year 2015 from the Missouri State Employees Charitable Campaign (MSECC). CTF exhibited during the MSECC kick-off in the Truman Building September 2015.

PetSmart Lucky & Chance Program

The PetSmart Lucky and Chance Program features the sale of plush dog and cat stuffed animals to support various community charities along with PetSmart Charities, which helps homeless pets. In July 2014, CTF received nearly 2200 Lucky and Chance stuffed animals from Virginia through its relationship with Kids and Cars, a national organization dedicated to keeping children safe in and around motor vehicles. CTF received an additional 350 animals from

Columbia PetSmart. CTF provided 1000 animals to the Kids and Cars headquarters in Kansas City for use to promote their Look Before You Lock program. CTF used the remaining 1550 animals to promote its Not Even for a Minute campaign, which encourages child safety in and around vehicles, by distributing them to the following: Child Advocacy Centers, Special Learning Center, Foster Adopt and Resource Center, Safe Kids Coalition, Safe Crib Projects, Jefferson City and Columbia Law Enforcement and Fire Departments, County Health Departments, pediatrician offices, child care centers and CTF grantees.

CTF Child Abuse & Neglect Prevention Conference – April 2015

CTF hosted the 2015 Child Abuse & Neglect Prevention Conference, *1Childhood4Every1*, April 14-15, 2015 at the Capitol Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City. Chair Award

CTF remembers former Missouri State Senator Harold Caskey (1938-2015)

In 1983, Senator Caskey was appointed to the very first Children's Trust Fund Board and was instrumental in the creation, early development and growth of CTF. He served on the Board for 17 years until 2000. Senator Caskey understood the need for and the importance of having resources specifically dedicated for the prevention of child abuse and neglect and building strong families.

National Alliance of Children's Trust and Prevention Funds

The Missouri Children's Trust Fund is an active member of the National Alliance of Children's Trust and Prevention Funds, an organization that provides training, technical assistance and peer consulting opportunities to state Children's Trust and Prevention Funds and strengthens their efforts to prevent child abuse. Their mission is to:

- ensure all states have a strong and effective Children's Trust or Prevention Fund capable of leading and investing in strategies, policies and best practices that prevent child abuse and neglect before it occurs;
- initiate and engage in national efforts that help state Children's Trust and Prevention Funds to strengthen families to prevent child abuse and neglect; and
- promote and support a system of services, laws, practices and attitudes that supports families by enabling them to provide their children with safe, healthy and nurturing childhoods.

Prevention Programming Fiscal Year 2015 (July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015)

General Prevention Grants

The CTF Board of Directors approved and awarded \$1,059,667 for Fiscal Year 2015 to sixty-four (64) community-based organizations and agencies throughout Missouri to provide programs and services that help support families reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect. CTF funded specific child abuse and neglect models that included safe sleep, infant nurturing, father support, grandparent support, home visitation, parent support and education, mentoring, respite care, sexual abuse prevention and training.

To promote sustainability, CTF commits funding to successful grantees on a five-year cycle. CTF funds projects at 100% during years one and two; in year three, CTF funds 75%, and the grantee provides a 25% local match; in year four, CTF funds 50%, and the local match is 50%; and in year five, CTF funds 25%, and the local match is 75%.

Community Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) Grants

Helping families help themselves is the primary goal of the Community Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) grant program. The Children's Trust Fund is the designated state lead to administer this federal initiative from the Administration of Children, Youth and Families (ACF), Department of Health and Human Services. Through development and implementation of collaborative provider networks, CBCAP communities provide coordinated delivery of prevention and support services to families and children; reduce duplication of existing services; maximize resources of public and private providers; and ultimately reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect. A strengths-based approach focused on building protective factors help families identify and develop their own strategic goals with guidance from the community program coordinator and assigned lead agency.

In Fiscal Year 2015, CTF awarded \$500,000 to support this model in five Missouri communities: The Alliance of Southwest Missouri (McDonald County), Barceda Families (Polk, Hickory and Dallas Counties), Jefferson County Community Partnership (Jefferson County), Great Circle/Project THRIVE (Adair County) and Great Circle/Growing Strong Families (Stone and Taney Counties). During that time, 167 high risk families representing 519 individuals received services through this project. Three of the communities were first-year sites and did not begin enrolling families until January 1, 2015.

The Missouri CBCAP model continues to be successful and gain high marks from the ACF relating to standards, performance, outcomes and evaluation. CBCAP sites show statistically significant improvement in scores of standardized measures of family risk (Child Abuse Potential Inventory) and distress (Parent Stress Index) among participating parents. Families and providers also report high levels of satisfaction with the services they receive and with the community collaboration model. In many cases communities have been able to successfully leverage other funds, thereby increasing their capacity to better serve families and sustain the program.

Discretionary Grants

CTF allocates a certain portion of its annual program budget to fund discretionary projects or 'mini-grants.' Discretionary funding is designed to be responsive to low-cost prevention projects or needs identified by individual communities, organizations or agencies. A maximum of \$5,000 per grant award is available for these special prevention projects. During Fiscal Year 2015 CTF awarded \$27,806 in discretionary funding to seven (7) grantees.

Missourians continue to make the CTF 'prevent child abuse' license plate the most popular specialty plate in the state. Through a unique and innovative program, License Plate Marketing Partner organizations throughout Missouri help promote and sell the plates to increase prevention awareness and raise funds that are returned directly back into the community for prevention programs. During Fiscal Year 2015, CTF distributed a total of \$122,219.88 to 35 community partner organizations with more than 78,774 children, parents, other caregivers and the general public directly benefitting as a result of these funds. Community organizations effectively use the funds for a wide variety of prevention programs including parenting classes, parent support groups, public awareness and education, home visitation for newborns, safe cribs and other supplies for infants, support for dads and teen parents, mentoring for expectant parents, crisis nursery and respite care, training for professionals, and many other programs.
