Where's Baby? Look Before You Lock.

- Check the back seat. Place your purse, briefcase, laptop or other personal item on the floorboard of the back seat area with the child to serve as a reminder to look.
- Practice extra caution especially during changes in your routine.
- Pay at the pump at gas stations.
- Use the drive-through convenience provided by banks, dry cleaners, pharmacies, restaurants & other businesses.







It's a tragedy you can prevent.

- Wever leave children alone in or around vehicles.
- 👑 Always Look Before You Lock. Establish a routine of checking the back seat every time you exit the car to ensure no one is left behind. Do not overlook sleeping infants.
- Ask your babysitter or childcare provider to call you if your child hasn't arrived as scheduled.
- 避 Place your child's diaper bag or a large stuffed animal in the front seat to serve as a constant, visible reminder of your child's presence in the car.
- 📲 Make your child as visible as possible. Place rear-facing car seats in the middle of the back seat.
- Always keep car keys & remote openers out of reach of children.
- Keep vehicles locked at all times, even at home, & remind your friends & neighbors to do the same. Unlocked cars pose a risk to children who are naturally curious & often fearless.
- When a child is missing, check vehicles & trunks immediately.
- Teach your children the dangers of a car & let them know it is not a toy or playground.
- 📲 Try to plan ahead when you have errands. Run errands when your spouse, trusted neighbor or friend can watch your child.
